## Hopi Butterfly Maiden

### **Class Description (10 minimum, 15 maximum)**

This sweet little Hopi Butterfly maiden will delight all who see her. You will have so much fun creating her that you'll want to rush home to make more. Her body is created from a banana gourd and a spinner gourd is used for her head. Those gourd scraps that you've been collecting will be put to good use when you start creating wings. Gloria will already have the class wings cut so all you'll need to do is a little sanding to smooth the backside in preparation for the wood-burning and ink dye. Several techniques will be used in this class, including a little wood-burning, a little sculpting, painting with acrylics applying two part patina solution. Minimal carving will be done when applying the wings.

**Walk-Ins Accepted?** Yes, as long as the total number of students don't exceed the maximum of 15 and they have their own tools.

### **Tools and/or supplies the student must bring to class:**

Students need to bring a dust mask or respirator, a variable heat wood-burner with a spear tip pen, power carver, a round ball burr, a X-acto knife with sharp blade, small flat or angle paint brush, small round paint brush suitable for painting the mask, hot glue gun with sticks and a heat tool.

### **Materials provided by teacher:**

Two gourds, (a banana gourd and a spinner gourd), pre-cut gourd wings, epoxy clay, ink dyes, acrylic paints, patina product, clear spray finish, wire for antenna, wood glue and wood disk. Instructor will bring one or two glue guns for shared class use if you don't have one.
