



The Idaho Gourd Society (IDGS) Is in action for an event filled summer. Take note of the dates of various activities and make sure you are an active club member!

IDGS Members make notes of the following,



Between now and August 12, 2023 <u>EACH</u> member is invited to create a gourd jack-o'-lantern. Your work can be any size, style, using any technique as long as it's made out of gourd (s). Each jack-o'-lantern will be brought to our August 12, 2023 monthly membership meeting and entered into the competition. Judging will be done by members attendance using an anonymous number ballot. **The winner of the challenge will receive a 2024 paid family** membership. Each entry in the competition will then be donated and given to our Gourd Store to be sold during the Festival. The jack-o'-lanterns will be sold for \$20.00 or less. Are you up for the challenge? Have some fun and as long as you are working on your competition gourds whip out a funny (or not) gourd.

Official rules-

- 1. You must be a member of the IDGS.
- 2. Entry must be the sole work if the entrant. For anyone with a disability, they may be assisted in their creation.
- 3. Only one entry per member can be entered.
- 4. Jack-o'-lantern must be made from gourds.
- 5. Jack-o-lantern must be donated to the IDGS Gourd Store and will be sold at a price determined by the Gourd Store.
- 6. You must bring your entry to the August Membership Meeting or have it delivered by August, 12, 2023 for judging.
- 7. Janet Melligh and /or the IDGS Board of Directors may add to or change these rules in the case


