It was interesting watching Lorrie painting minuscule lines on her Owl Gourd with the finest of brushes. Takes a steady hand, as well as, great eyesight. Lorrie uses lids from bottles for the small amount of paint needed for her project. This is a inexpensive paint saving tip to keep in mind.



You can see the owl 's wings are actually pulled away from the main body of the gourd. Steve Kiser has perfected this manipulation technique which I hope to have him explain in another Gourd Shard!
